Overview

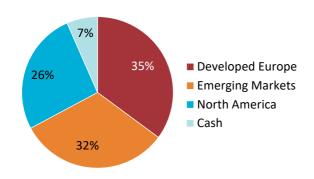

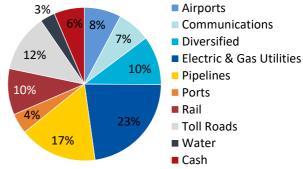

Portfolio performance review

The 4D Global Infrastructure Fund was up a net 0.06% (AUD) in October, under-performing the benchmark return of 0.60% (by 0.54%) but out-performing the FTSE 50/50 Infrastructure Index, which was down 1.30% (AUD) in October. The A\$ finished at 0.6893, up a strong 2.1%.

The strongest portfolio performer for October was China Resources Gas, up 22.1% on sector momentum but no real stock specific news.

The weakest performer in October was Chilean water operator Aguas Andinas, down 14.7% post Chilean geo-political turmoil.

Despite a slowing global macro environment, we remain supportive of our overweight to user pays assets. However, ongoing geopolitical issues see us limiting exposure to certain regions (eg UK).

Market review

Despite a restless global macro backdrop, equities were strong in October. The US S&P 500 was up 2.17%, touching an all-time high towards month-end (and now up over 11% for 2019), the broader MSCI World Index was up 2.57% and EMs were also up 4.23%.

The global economy is in a synchronized slowdown and the IMF downgraded forecast growth for 2019 to 3%, its slowest pace since the GFC. In China, GDP growth for 3Q19 was slightly disappointing, down from 6.2% YoY in 2Q19 to 6% YoY in 3Q19, and a 6.1% consensus forecast. Even in a traditionally strong growth country like Singapore, retrenchments are rising, companies are more cautious about raising wages, and it's getting harder for those who lose their jobs to find new work. Reflecting the global slowdown, the US Fed cut rates for the third time this year to 1.5%.

The big geo-political development for the month was the potential Brexit exit for the UK. PM Johnson secured an exit deal with the EU, got it through Parliament and successfully called a national election for 12 December to effectively seek a mandate to exit the EU on the terms agreed. This is the big difference with the earlier referendum. At the upcoming election, UK voters will know exactly what a 'Brexit' looks like rather than at the referendum where the detailed shape of a Brexit was simply unknown. Therefore, 'informed' decisions can hopefully be made come December 12.

However, the world remains unsettled. HK suffered through another month of protests with increasing violence a worrying development. The protests may have moved HK into recession. In Spain, Catalan separatists took to the streets of Barcelona after many of their leaders were jailed by the Supreme Court over an attempt to break away from Spain back in 2017. In Chile, antigovernment protests raged & impeachment talk flowed in the US.

In Emerging Markets, Indian PM Modi is on his bike promoting his country internationally. With the nation grappling with its worst economic slowdown in 6 years, Mr Modi has already visited nearly a dozen nations since his landslide re-election win in May, seeking investments from the Middle East, sharing a stage with Donald Trump in Texas and hosting Chinese President Xi Jinping at a seaside resort. Now that is a sales pitch!

Argentina decisively elected left-wing leader Alberto Fernandez its new president in the hope of a reprieve from the country's economic crisis. However, just hours later, the central bank imposed significantly stricter controls on the purchase of US dollars underlining the scale of the economic challenge facing the new socialist/populist government.

Outlook

We have a very positive outlook for global listed infrastructure (GLI) over the medium term. There are a number of powerful macro forces at play which we believe will continue to support the sector. There has been a huge underinvestment in infrastructure around the world over the past 30 years. As governments seek to redress this problem, public sector fiscal and debt constraints will limit their ability to respond, meaning there will be an ever-increasing need for private sector capital as part of the funding solution. In addition, the world's population is expected to grow by 53% by the end of this century, which will be accompanied by an emerging middle class, especially in Asia. These forces will compel new, improved and expanded infrastructure around the world. GLI's very attractive investment attributes will make it an important part of the financing solution to the world's infrastructure needs and, we believe, see it continue to grow and prosper over the longer term.
